Common interview questions	
Employers want to see that you have a genuine interest in the company by asking questions like:	 What do you know about the company? Why do you think you are a good fit for our company? Why do you want to work for us?
Employers will want to get to know you and may ask questions like:	What do you do in your spare time?What are your hobbies and interests?
The strengths employers look for will depend on the job role. They may ask questions such as:	What are your main strengths?Why should we hire you?
Weaknesses- You should be honest when answering questions on your weaknesses: Say how you are working to improve them.	 Do you have any weaknesses?
At the end of the interview, employers usually ask if you have any questions for them. This is your chance to show your interest in the company and your enthusiasm for the job. You could ask:	 What is it like to work here? What does a typical day involve? How do you see the company developing in the next few years? Will there be any training opportunities after I start?
