Dear parent(s)/carer(s)

I hope this email finds you and your families well.

We have had another very positive week at Newark Academy with 82379 positive behaviour points awarded to our students in recognition of their excellent standards of work, attitudes to learning and behaviour. Furthermore, our overall school attendance is above 95% which is very encouraging as it means the vast majority of our students have accessed education every day this week.

One of the highlights of my week has been visiting lessons and seeing just how engaged your children have been in their learning. It has been a real pleasure to witness their enthusiasm, focus, and curiosity across a range of subjects, and I am incredibly proud of the positive learning environment they are helping to create.



Assemblies

This week's full crew assemblies with students had a teaching and learning focus – Engagement in Learning and Talk for Thinking. Miss Elsey asked each student to reflect honestly on how they approach their learning. She shared some of the ways their teachers will challenge, and support, them to think more deeply and explained how this would increase their enjoyment, engagement and understanding of what is being taught. Miss Elsey focused specifically on how teachers are keen to develop classroom talk and provide more opportunities for students to think, shape their thoughts and opinions, and discuss and answer questions with others. It isn't something that everyone finds easy and it is a life skill we are committed to helping our students develop during their time with us. The assembly explored the role good communication plays in







being able to express ourselves clearly, build relationships, solve disagreements and how it gives us the confidence to stand up for what we believe. Communication skills support our personal wellbeing and are also one of the key skills employers look for. The assembly ended by introducing students to a 'Talk for Thinking' framework teachers will follow.

<u>SatchelOne</u>

At Newark Academy we use an online learning platform, SatchelOne, to set and monitor homework. Students, staff and parents/carers can all access this. Year 8-11s and Year 13s are already familiar with SatchelOne and this week were reminded on how to access it and the of the importance of using the system to stay on top of their homework/independent learning. Our new students in Year 7 and Year 12s have now logged onto the system for the first time, and they will be sharing parent codes with you so you can also access it. We will monitor this closely and will, of course, provide this information if needed. Simply search via Google for SatchelOne, click on the link and then type in Newark Academy when asked to search for your school. You then select 'Parent', click 'Create an Account' and then add the code your child has given you. We encourage all parents and carers to regularly check SatchelOne, where they can view the homework that has been set for their child, track completion, and see scores achieved on quizzes and assignments. This visibility helps support students in managing their workload and celebrating their progress.




You will be asked to enter your schools name: Newark Academy When the login screen appears, press 'Sign in with Office 365'. Students then sign with their school email and password. This will be the same which they use to login to the school computers.

- 1. Click on 'Account Settings'

- 3. Click 'Show Code' and make a note.




Creating an Account

On the login screen, click on 'Parent' and then 'Create an account'. Enter the code from the previous steps.

You then need to register an account with SatchelOne, and then you can use this for all future logins with the online platform.

Our students have been directed to a member of staff in school who is available at breaks and lunches if they are experiencing problems logging on.
